

Sending copies of ADMIRALTY Charts and Publications to vessels at sea

We are aware that copies of ADMIRALTY Charts and Publications are occasionally sent to vessels at sea by faxing and/or emailing portions of a paper chart or publication, or by emailing portions of an ARCS chart.

There are inherent safety risks in copying as copies may not be of sufficiently good quality to enable safe navigation. Copying paper charts can distort the image and scale of a chart. In some cases, details may be lost altogether. Transmission of copies by fax is likely to introduce further distortion.

We do not condone such practices and we have not given permission to copy and send our material in this way.

Exceptionally however, we are prepared to grant retrospective permission to copy and send ADMIRALTY Charts and Publications to vessels at sea if we consider that the action was justified. If we do not consider the action to have been justified, then we will not grant retrospective permission and there will have been infringement of our copyright and/or that of another nation. Where the copyright is ours, and we do not consider the action to have been justified, we will charge a licence fee to cover the reproduction and correct the infringement. Where the copyright belongs to another nation, we will inform them of what has happened so that they can decide what action to take.

You must tell us as soon as possible, by contacting UKHO Customer Services, if you have copied and sent ADMIRALTY Charts and Publications and explain why you did it. We will then determine whether your action was justified. We are unable to give you advice on what actions are justified, as we will review each event on its merits.

In any event, we cannot accept any liability for any reliance placed on copies sent in this way. Anyone involved in such practices must accept all risks involved.
